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ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT C.Y 2018



BULAN WATER DISTRICT HISTORY

Bulan Water District has been recipient of big loans from LWUA with actual availments aggregating Ph 35.937 Million as of March 31, 1997. The bulk of these financial assistance came from:

- (a.)Initial Php 100,000.00 mini loan granted in July 1978 to finance the construction of the office building.
- (b.)Php 5.150 Million IIP loan approved in august 1979 which finance the immediate interim improvements needs. In 1981, the Phase 1-A project was implemented under the management of Mr. Antonio O. Vytiaco. The improvements program involved the replacement of old cast iron pipes with 225 mm UPVC pipes from mariboc Spring up to Barangay Roxas with an approximate length of 5 kilometers.
- (c.)Level III loan amounting to Php 32.089 Million (net of Php 6.343 Million government grant) approved in December 1992 to finance the rehabilitation and replacement of transmission distribution mains and purchase of service connection materials. In 1993, the Interim Improvement Program (IIP) was implemented for additional transmission and distribution mains from Barangay Roxas to the town proper using 200 mm UPVC pipes passing the ground reservoir at Barangay Somagongsong to augment the water pressure with a total length of 17,844 meters.

Funded under DANIDA V package, the said Level III project aimed to address the existing system deficiencies such as the inadequate water supply brought about by a very high unaccounted for water.

Implementation of the project, however, suffered delays and it was only in mid 1995 that it was reported complete. It is worth mentioning that the BWD has been up-to-date in its loan obligations with LWUA. Records of Bulan Water District is remarkably impressive as far as LWUA loan obligations settlement is concern.

In 2008, the Bulan Water Distirct acquired an additional source- the Halagok-hagok Spring in Barangay Calpi, whereby the Local Government Unit(LGU) Bulan constructed the two(2) intake tanks. This project was interconnected at Barangay Roxas with a total length of 4200 meters using 150 mm PVC pipes.

WATER SOURCES:

At present, the Bulan Water District Water Supply System maintains two(2) spring sources; one is the Mariboc Spring at Barangay Dolos and the other one is the Halagok-hagok Spring at Barangay Calpi with individual intake boxes. Two(2) deepwells at sitio Pawa and at Barangay Lajong.

With the rapid increase on demands for water services, the concessionaires of Bulan have increasingly asking for sufficient supply of water. On this process the Bulan Water District has been utilizing water supply from Mariboc Spring at Brg. Dolos, Bulan, Sorsogon, this has been the standard operation for so many decades.

The Mariboc Spring is the main water source that supplies more than half of the BWD concessionaires but as the time goes by the spring has been depleting to its critical level due to deforestation, extreme weather condition and below normal rainfall. Because of the rapid depletion BWD lost 898 concessionaires by second quarter of 2015. This has alarmed the management to develop a new water source to augment water that will sustain the water supply of Bulan. The Bulan Water District is conducting research specifically the Vulnerability Assessment Plan, Emergency Response Plan in compliance to the Risk Reduction in the Municipality of Bulan.

The Bulan Water District has received the Certificate on Compliance for Water Safety Plan dated September 4, 2018 valid until September 4, 2021. At present the Bulan Water District is conducting more projects to be recognized in the Water Service Industry.

MARIBOC SPRING

The Mariboc Spring is located at Brg. Dolos, Bulan, Sorsogon its maximum capacity is 45 lps during Year 2010-2012. As the climate change came thru depletion of Water occurred that has provided the water depletion dilemma, at present the spring has a capacity of 40 lps for C.Y 2017. It is a spring from above the mountains that supplies water necessities for the concessionaire of Bulan.

The Spring is currently depleting due to excessive summner heat, but being rehabilitated thru reforestation. The Spring service 65% of the Barangays under the service of Bulan Water District. This source has passed the Philippine National Standard fro Drinking Water.

At present the Bulan Water District has started developing a mini water-shed to ensure the regeneration of water supply at the Maribok Spring. The BWD Management plans to incorporate the proposal for declaration of Protected Watershed to the Sangguniang Bayan on the $1^{\rm st}$ quarter of CY 2019 to develop the Water Source and ensure the contribution to Reforestation and reduce the Green House Effect of Global Warming.

HALAGOK-HAGOK SPRING

Halagok-hagok Spring source is located at lot 5204 owned by the Bulan Water District by way of absolute sales from Iluminada R. Asuncion-Guzman. The parcel of land is situated at Barangay Calpi, Bulan, Sorsogon containing an area of 25,260 square meters.

Lot 5204 is titled in the name of Bulan Water District. The spring serve as a recharging water source to support the Mariboc Spring, its maximum capacity is 5 lps. At present this is the place for seedlings and mini soil bed to develop the trees that will be planted for the Mini-Water Shed. There are pili, bamboos and other endemic plants and trees being taken care of to ensure the growth of the plants and trees.

SITIO PAWA DEEPWELL

Sitio Pawa Deep Well was develop thru the effort of BWD Internal Cash Generated (ICG) Fund.After series of Geo-physical Analysis, it has been approved to construct a deep well at sitio Pawa last March 2016. It has been operational in the middle of October, 2016, with a maximum capacity of 10 lps. Constructed a pump House to ensure that equipment and chlorinator are in safe storage. Sitio Pawa is currently servicing Barangay Lajong, Bliss, Zone 8, ICS and San Vicente, for 24 hours daily operations.

At present, Sitio Pawa helps on the Augmentation of Water Supply in the Baranggays surrounding the area, it helps the distribution of enough water supply to concessionaires specifically that there is a Hospital at the Area.

BARANGAY LAJONG DEEP WELL

Lot 1180 py of the Bulan Cadastral Survey containing an area of Seven Thousand Six Hundred Sixteen (7616) square meters, more or less, and bounded as follows; North-Beguin River and Lot 1180 pt; East Lot 1181; South Lot 1181 and Lot 1178; and on the Wet Lot by Lot 1179. Coconut tress are its permanent improvements. Still declared in the name of Arenio Gerero under ARP No. 2002-023-0366 effective year 2003.

The acquisition of the lot in Barangay Lajong , Bulan, Sorsogon for a deep well project last July 08, 2015 had open beneficial advantage not onl to the constituent of Barangay Lajong but more so the whole area of the BWD distribution lines and other Barangays for expansion and areas that have no supply of water.

The Deep Well is powered by submersible pumps with a maximum capacity of 10 lps to supply water on the nearby Barangays. The deep well is not operational due to rehabilitation to eradicate the iron and manganese content. The Iron Manganese Water Treatment Removal has been installed and currently provided good result and has eradicate the sign of Iron and Manganese, the Physical/Chemical as of the present has ensured that the water supply has complied to the Philippine Nation Standard for Drinking Water (PNSDW).

RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE LWUA MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 005-18 – GUIDELINES IN THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF WATER SERVICE INTERRUPTION

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the directive of the President per Cabinet Action/Decisions dated February 5, 2018, from Cabinet Secretary Leoncio B. Evasco Jr., all Water Districts (WDs) and Rural Waterworks System Associations (RWSAs) are hereby required to announce <u>scheduled water service interruptions</u>, through any of the following means, at least (3) days before the scheduled interruptions:

- a. People's Television Network (PTV 4); and/or
- b. The Nearest television Network
- c. National or local radio Stations
- d. National or local print media;
- e. Social media platforms e.g., facebook twitter etc.

WHEREAS, in the adoption of the BWD to the said memorandum, the following means of communication shall be selected:

- a. Local Radio Station
- b. Local Television Network Provider
- c. Social Media Platforms: Facebook, Official Website of BWD
- d. BWD SMS Scheme
- e. Posting of Announcement on Conspicuous Places. (using full size cartolina, illustration boards or tarpaulins)

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE POLICY GUIDELINES IN THE ISSUANCE OF CLEARANCE FOR PRIVATE WATER SERVICE PROVIDERS SUCH AS WATER REFILLING STATION PRIOR ISSUANCE OF MUNICIPAL BUSINESS PERMIT AT THE LGU-BULAN.

WHEREAS, the Bulan Water District is held responsible in the Water Safety and Water Quality for concessionaires of Bulan, whether Residential, Commercial or Industrial Connection.

WHEREAS, the BWD will issue Clearance to Water Refilling Stations after inspection to ensure that the water supply that will be catered to their clients is from our water source to ensure the safety and quality water.

WHEREAS, in the event that the Water Refilling station has an existing water source (such as Deep Wells, Shallow Wells and etc) and found fraudulently using it to serve their clients, their Clearance will be revoked or the BWD shall not issue clearance.

WHEREAS, the BWD endeavors to determine that prior issuance of water clearance, the Water Refilling station will comply on the Philippine National Standard for Drinking Water (PNSDW) to ensure the water safety of their clients

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE REVISED POLICY GUIDELINES FOR THE BALIK-TAKOD PROGRAM OF THE BULAN WATER DISTRICT FOR C.Y 2018
